
Saham Toney Neighbourhood Plan Survey December 2021


Introduction


On 13 December 2021, a short online smart survey was sent to members of the Saham Toney neighbourhood plan team. This document presents the response to the smart survey.





























Q9. If you would like to share anything else about the Saham Toney Neighbourhood Plan, you may do so here:

Seven respondents answered this open ended question as follows:

R1	The Work Group was a diverse team, with very strong leadership. It was more focussed on, and much more committed to, the project than the Parish Council or Breckland. I very much hope that the new Work Group gets the support and necessary resources from the PC.
R2	It's something I'm proud of and I think it will benefit the village. Otherwise please see the work group's lessons learned
R4	The STNP will be an asset to the village and hopefully it will help control development in the next few years, however this will always be dependent on the Parish Council and District Council using/ referring to it when making planning decisions. The NP team should be congratulated on creating the plan and seeing it through to being made by BDC.
R7	The STNP will be a great asset to the parish and I look forward to using it when commenting on Planning Applications.
R8	In my opinion, Breckland District Council have just played lip service to the Neighbourhood Planning process, they have not assisted in a constructive manner, finding fault with the majority of the Saham Toney Neighbourhood Plan submissions. The STNP now forms part of the Local Plan and should be an asset to Council Planning, unfortunately they do not see it this way, so much for Localism.
R9	I am very impressed by the Working Group that led this very complex and challenging process. Their commitment and sustainability was amazing and we would not have achieved it without their dedication. It will be a valuable plan for the village.
R10	I hope that the PC take full ownership of the Plan going forward and that they present robust objections to planning applications that do not comply.
